GRAEME JEWELL—Very tall and deceptively fast with great spring. Represented Queensland 1970, great kick

GREG SHEATHER — Lockhart Coach, very fast with long kick and safe pair of hands.

ROSS ELWIN — Very rugged player who has played with South Melbourne, coach of Culcairn

PETER ROUNDSEVELL—A 100 minute ruckman, coach of The Rock-Yerong Creek, has great ball disposal.

TERRY LEAHY — Has played with South Melbourne, mobile rugged player, coach of Grong Grong Malong

JOHN NORTHEY Played 125 games with Richmond (Vic.). The most polished footballer in Sydney. A great "ballgetter" and a tremendous inspiration to his side. Has represented Victoria and N.S.W.

BOB JUBBER. Hails from Sandhurst in the Bendigo League. Exciting backman.

V.F.L. 2nds PEN PORTRAITS

KEN GREENWOOD — Captain of Footscray, high marking followers has played over 130 senior League games, 52 with Carlton and 76 with Footscray, will give this young team a great deal of experience and balance.

GRAHAM OSBORNE — One of the most versatile players in the team, Graham also has many senior V.F.L. games experience, 80 in all with Melbourne. He has played ruck, centre, centre half back, centre half forward.

IAN MCGINNESS, full back — Star of the team he plays with, being named best afield in seven of 10 games. Strong mark and great long kick. Defender who backs his judgment and in line for early senior promotion.

BILL NALDER — Ruck. Recently played in two senior V.F.L. games with top side. Strong mark and rugged type who bullocks his way through packs. Named best afield in Grand Final last year.

IAN HARVEY — Ruck forward pocket. Played in Under 19's and has had few games in Reserve Grade. Changes into forward pocket, where his height in marking can do most for team.

PETER STEPHENS — Full forward. Ruck, tall, high marking player who can hold down key position, fast mover for his size, kicked many goals in Reserves and has played last few matches with seniors.

GROWTH OF THE CODE

IN N.S.W.

In 1902 a group of expatriates from Melbourne at a meeting which formed the N.S.W. Australian National Football League.

Eleven teams—East Sydney, North Shore, Sydney, Balm, Redfern, Paddington, Newtown, Y.M.C.A., Ashfield, West Sydney and Alexandria—took part in competition in 1903, with East Sydney being premiers and North Shore runners-up. In this year Fitzroy played Collingwood at the Sydney Cricket Ground.

The game flourished up to and during World War II, but declined with a fall in gates and administration difficulties in the post-war period and during the 50's.

In 1960 the League appointed a full-time Secretary, whilst another major

AUSTRALIAN RULES IN BORNEO

Sarawak part of the island of Borneo is the scene of the latest expansion of the Australian Rules code.

The actual place in Sarawak is the town of Bau, which is 22 miles from Kuching.

The instigator of the spread of Aussie Rules is Len Minty, erstwhile umpire on the Sydney scene and team manager of last year's CHS State side.

Len is teaching school at Bau and at the week-ends he has organised games of Australian Rules. His school has 380 pupils of whom about 270 are boarders. These boarders are being taught the

advancement was made in 1968 when the League moved into its own administrative headquarters building at 64 Regent Street. Further strengthening of the machinery was made with the appointment of a full-time Junior and Schools Organiser in 1971.

The Riverina Amendment to the A.F.C. Regulations in 1971 enabled N.S.W. players although affiliated with another State, to play in representative N.S.W. teams. Thus strengthened, N.S.W. defeated the Australian Amateurs in the Section II Carnival in Brisbane last year and went down to Canberra in the final.

Today, apart from the Sydney Metropolitan area, the game is played and controlled by the New South Wales League at Newcastle and on the South Coast.
