SFL Top Four in Close Fight

The evenness of the top four SFL sides was clearly illustrated last weekend when Western Suburbs came from behind to inflict an exciting five point defeat upon East Sydney in Sunday's curtain-raiser at the Sydney Cricket Ground.

Round 16 of the SFL-Escort 1980 Premiership saw the margin between all of the top four clubs — East, North, West and Newtown narrowed down to a difference of only two games.

North Shore destroyed any hopes of Pennant Hills making the finals when they defeated the Demons by 41 points on Saturday at the Hills.

The win by the AVCO Bears firmed the Final Four, but places and fortunes could alter in the next five weeks with Pennant Hills having a big say in the next few matches when they meet with three of the leaders.

As we enter the five rounds to close the minor season, West and North will meet twice. The results of both these encounters will greatly influence second position and double chance.

Focal point of last weekend's football feast was the performance of two full-forwards — PETER RUSCUKLIC (East) and MICHAEL ROACH (Richmond) who thrilled SCG fans in both of last Sunday's matches.

RUSCUKLIC kicked the Bulldogs well on the way to their 14th win with seven great goals in the first three quarters.

On 97 goals before the match against West, Ruscuklic quickly attained his second century of goals in Sydney football at the 20-minute mark of the first term.

RESIGNATION OF PRESIDENT

The following statement was issued by the NSW AFL/SFL General Manager RUSSELL HOPPER last Tuesday morning —

"On July 8 at the SYDNEY FOOTBALL LEAGUE Board of Directors meeting a motion of no confidence was moved in the President, MR. BERNARD HEAFEY.

This motion was in respect of the President's failure to adhere to a direction of the Board handed down earlier in the year.

Mr. Heafey subsequently tendered his resignation as President of the SYDNEY FOOTBALL LEAGUE and the NSW LEAGUE. This was accepted by the Board on July 17.

At this time, no replacement has been made concerning the Presidency."

Richmond's 34.18-222 scored at the SCG last Sunday is a new club record for the VFL Tigers.

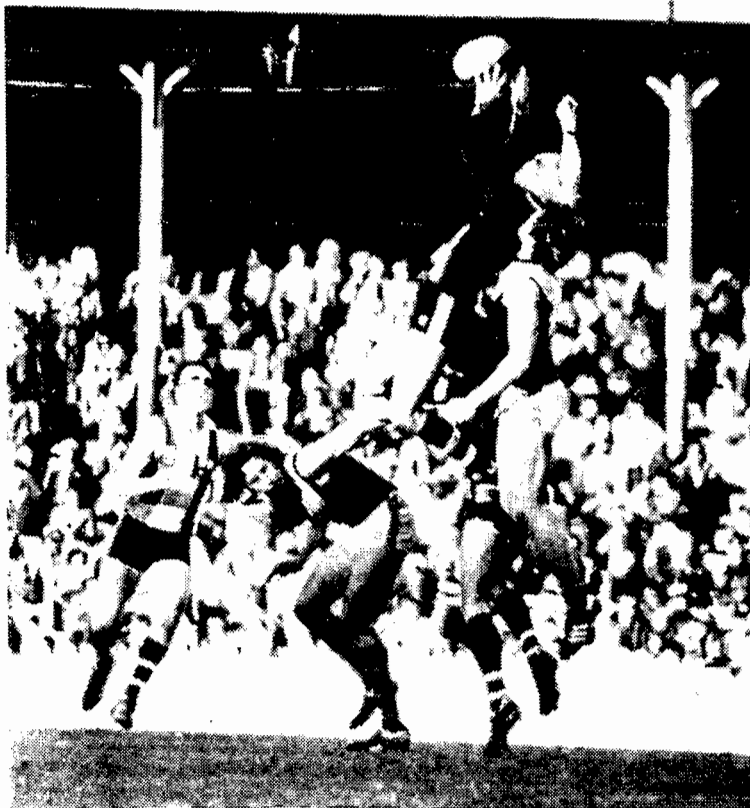

At Pennant Hills on Saturday, it looked as though the SFL Demons were going to go on to a big win over North Shore. The AVCO Bears came into the last stanza five points down, but then hit their straps.

With a couple of subtle changes North coach JOHN PITURA turned the tide for the red-and-black to hold onto second spot.

At Olds Park, after an even first term, Newtown careered away to a very necessary percentage boosting win over St. George by 95-points.

GLEESON, RAY, BARWELL and PILKINGTON were best afield for the Towners, while KELSO, EVANS, BROWN and BLACKLAW were good contributors for the Saints.

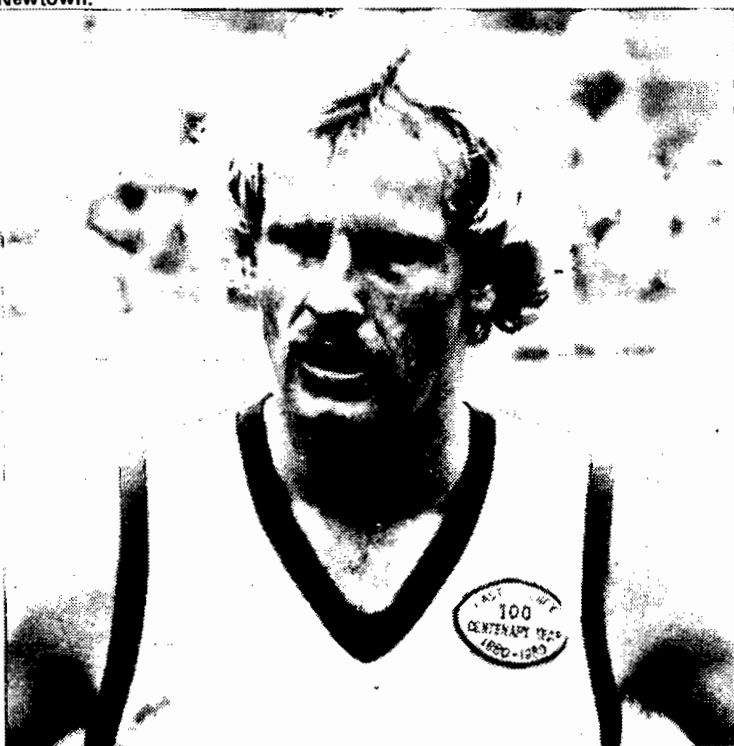


Nirimba returned from a three-week lay-off of leave in the Association Under 20 grade last week, and in successive days suffered two shock defeats.

BANKSTOWN CLINCH FINALS BERTH

A two-goal win to Bankstown Sports over Campbelltown last Saturday appears to have clinched third place for the green and golds in the race for the Sydney Association Escort Premiership.

St. Ives firmed their hold on top place and the minor premiership with an exciting seven-point victory over 4th placed Sydney University.

Even though Uni of NSW enjoyed a big success over bottom-placed Parramatta, they face an uphill task of displacing either Bankstown or Sydney University in the remaining three rounds.

Their true value will be found in performances against both Bankstown and Campbelltown in the last two games.
