CHANGES ARE COMING !!

Football on the Central Coast has had it's ups and downs since the introduction of the game here in 1972.

Granted it has made significant advancements since those early days of nearly 30 years ago but it hasn't advanced far enough in the eyes of most local club administrators.

The best we could do in senior grades was seven clubs playing first grade and reserves in 1995. That though has fallen away to a participation rate in first and reserve grades this year, nearly back to our illustrious 1983 effort of four first grade teams and here we are with almost an additional 100,000 people!

A plus for the competition though this year was the introduction of the Under 18 grade. With the inclusion of two Newcastle sides, Cardiff and Newcastle City, it bumped the number of teams up to six.

This up and down, in and out, hot and cold situation football finds itself in is not good for the players, clubs, supporters nor the game itself.

Ask yourself this question: *Are we advancing or just marking time?*

The reconstituted state body, the AFL (NSW/ACT), is attempting the reconstruction of football throughout the state. Much has been done to alter the very mind set of senior football in Sydney and that's no easy job after almost 100 years of the game being administered basically the same way.

Well, our turn is next!

A Task Force from the AFL (NSW/ACT) has visited the Central Coast on a number of occasions over the past four months where they have spoken to local administrators on their ideas of how the game should be better presented locally

Last night, Craig Davis, Football Operations Manager in Sydney gave a Power Point presentation of how the game will be changed here and how that change will effect the players and clubs.

It set out what we can expect and how different these changes will make our football. Included in the plans is a fulltime General Manager for football in the northern region (subject to Commission approval), which includes the Central Coast and the appointment of an independent board locally.

It discussed accountability and how clubs, coaches and umpires will be called on to be more accountable for their actions. A reporting system will be introduced to check that these personnel are doing what they agreed.

Grounds and facilities too have been closely examined.

It is no secret that some of the venues used in this league are second rate. Graeme Watson, a consultant to the AFL (NSW/ACT) and former international cricketer has been on the Central Coast and Newcastle inspecting grounds and facilities and will make far reaching recommendations which will have a significant impact on local clubs in the near future.

A major change will be the re-introduction of a ground at Mt Penang into our league. Used as a finals venue for a number of seasons, the current Mt Penang site will pass from the Juvenile Justice Commission to a special authority where a new ground and facilities is already under way at Kariong.

Of course with the announcement only being made last night we don't have the complete details of all the changes.

We will provide you with a detailed report in the Grand Final Record next week.

1999 Presentation Night.....

Mingara Recreation Club last night was the venue for the 1999 Annual Davey Medal Presentation Night.

The Davey Medal is awarded to the League's Best and Fairest Player as voted by the Field Umpires on a weekly basis

Peninsula Swans' Jorgen Jacobsen is the 1999 Davey Medallist. He polled 15 votes to win by 6 votes from Kristen Williams who was second on a count back from David Hamilton (Terrigal Avoca) and Stephen Munnery (Peninsula Swans)

The Granland Medal for the Reserve Grade Best and Fairest was awarded to Glen Harris of Terrigal Avoca who also won by 6 votes from Kelvin Johnson (Terrigal Avoca) and Glen Rushton (Peninsula Swans) tied for second after the count back

The Bottrill Medal for the Under 18 Best and Fairest was taken out by Brett Appleton (Terrigal Avoca) who won by a solitary vote from Justin Daley (Killarney Vale). Equal third were Daniel Watson and Rowan Grace from Newcastle City.

2GO FM Leading Goal Kicker Award for First Grade was won by Terrigal Avoca's Maurice Goolagong with 70 goals from Alan Martin (Killarney Vale) who kicked 43.

The 2GO FM Reserve Grade Leading Goal Kicker was Glen Harris with 68 from Darren Cann, also of Terrigal Avoca on 26 goals.

The Under 18's Leading Goal Kicker was Bateau Bay's Jarrod Brittle with 40 goals from Justin Daley of Killarney Vale with 38.

The Central Coast Express Advocate Rookie of the Year was also named.

The award this year went to John Deitz of Gosford.

The rookie of the year is selected from players who are playing in their first season of Senior Football and are ex-junior of the CCAFL.

The Coach of the year was Dean Wall of Terrigal Avoca.

The Club Championship for 1999 was also announced.

The Club Championship is decided on a points per win basis for each Club in every grade with the highest point scorer being the winner.

Umpires Corner...By Keith Ogston

BALL!! - Law 11.5.1

The cry of "Ball" rings out loud and often at all AFL games that you attend. The major reason for this is the fact that many people are unaware that this law was changed at the beginning of the 1996 season. The purpose of this law was to penalise players who have had a "prior opportunity" to dispose of the ball before being legally tackled.

Law 11.5.1 states: "A player in possession of the ball who has had a reasonable time (prior opportunity) to dispose of the ball must, when legally held by an opponent firmly enough to retard his progress, dispose of the ball by a kick or handball within a reasonable time of being held, otherwise a free kick shall be awarded against the player for failing to dispose of the ball in a legal manner."

This rule only applies to a player who has had prior opportunity! It was never meant to penalise the "ball getter" who works hard to get the ball in a pack and is immediately tackled and dispossessed. Obviously in this case it will be a play on call! However, the "ball carrier" who runs metres and "takes on opponents" or runs and has a bounce (and is legally tackled), needs to be aware that he must get a kick or handball away! An attempted kick or handball is not enough in this circumstance. This law gives the tackler more rights when the "ball carrier" is tackled.

The Blood Rule

People may have noticed in AFL and SFL matches when the "Blood Rule" has been invoked the Field Umpire jogs/walks/runs to the boundary with the player concerned.

This is done to keep the game moving and also to prompt the coaches bench to prepare a player for "interchange".

Coaches and Club Officials need to be aware that there is no need to wait until the bleeding player is off the ground. The interchange can be effected whilst the bleeding player is 30-40 metres (or further) from the "Interchange Area".

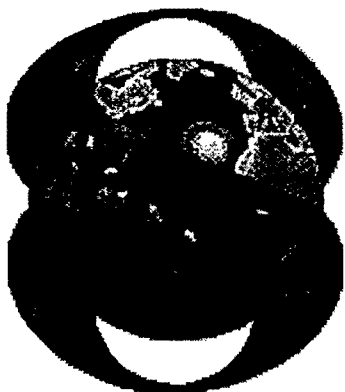
The point to be remembered is that once the blood rule has been invoked the player must leave the field and the game cannot restart until his replacement player is on the field and in position. No side should fear "too many players on the field" in a blood rule situation.

By The Way.....

The Davey Medal is Awarded to the player judged to be the best and fairest in the first grade competition on a weekly 3-2-1 voting system judged by the central umpires.

The medal was named after Mick Davey who was one of the founders of the game here on the Central Coast and became the league's inaugural treasurer in the first four years.

Many fine and outstanding players have won the trophy including Gary McBain (the current president of the Central Coast AFL) who won it in 1977 whilst playing for the now defunct Narara-Wyoming side. This year's winner was Jorgen Jacobsen of Peninsula Swans.

Terrigal-Avoca's Maurice Goolagong has won the 2GO Leading Goalkicking Award for the second time in his career on the Central Coast.

He last won it when playing with Peninsula Swans in 1997 with 115 goals. This year he has kicked 70 majors from the full forward position.

Twenty three year old, Goolagong, came from the Northern Riverina town of Barellan. He settled into full forward and has proved to be a very accurate kick for goal, particularly on the run when he swings onto his left foot.

Maurice has now booted well over 350 goals in the CCAFL but unfortunately broke his wrist in the final round of the home and away matches this year thwarting any thought he might have had of playing in a premierships side with Terrigal-Avoca.

Terrigal-Avoca's Glen Harris has had an outstanding season at full forward in Reserve Grade and obviously caught the eye of the umpires with his fair, yet lethal brand of football.

He recorded an outstanding 14 votes to win the Granland Medal, the Reserve Grade's the best and fairest award.

Not only did he win the league's best player award, but he also kicked 68 goals to win the reserve grade Leading Goal Kicker Award.

Jarrold Brittle (Bateau Bay) has booted his name into the record books. He kicked 40 goals to take out the Under 18 Leading Goalkicker Award and set himself on a career in Australian Football with no telling where he might end up.
