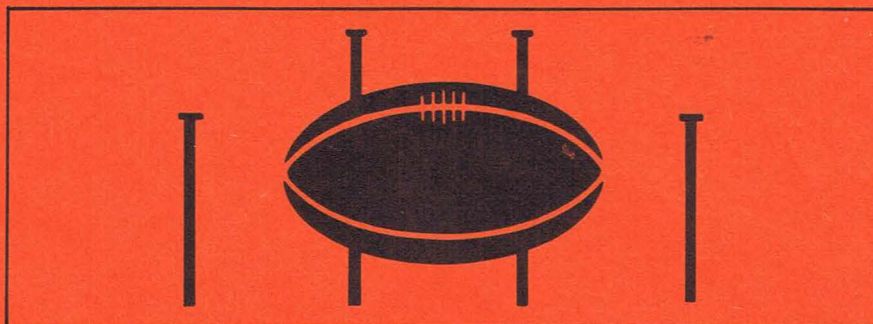

## PRESIDENTS REPORT

The year started on a disappointing note with the Wyoming team dropping out of the competition and Woy Woy, after having high hopes of being able to field two senior sides were, finally, unable to do so.

This left six senior sides to battle out the premiership and it was evident that our optimism of the previous year, when it was hoped that the revamped competition would provide a stimulus for the future development of the game, was sadly misplaced.

For the first time, due to the effects of Vice President Glenn Armstrong, the league was successful in gaining a major sponsor. The contribution which "Houseproud" made to the League throughout the season greatly eased the financial burden and on behalf of the CCAFL I thank them for their generous assistance.

Our pre-season Media function was also chosen as the opportunity to announce the representative coach for the 1985 season. This position was keenly contested, the League receiving no less than four submissions, all of which were submitted by highly qualified applicants.

After much consideration the decision was made in favour of Robbie Barrett, a newcomer to the area who had been recently appointed Captain Coach of the Woy Woy side. A number of people at this "Social function" reacted to Barretts appointment in a manner which would cast serious doubts about their rights to be called "sportsmen". Barrett however indicated the decision of the League executive by proving to be an outstanding coach and a great ambassador for Australian Football on the Central Coast.

Our senior representative side performed magnificently during the Country Championships, going down to Newcastle in a hard fought match at the SCG after thrashing the much fancied South Coast side at the SCG the previous week. My congratulations go to Rob Barrett and all the rep squad members for their tremendous effort. My thanks also to all the officials who helped make this occasion such a memorable one.

While the country championships this year must rate as our most successful ever representative effort, it also presents us with a few vexing questions:-

1. Can this league afford the expense of such a heavy programme?
2. Is it too discriptive to our domestic Competition?
3. Does it place too great a demand on our players and officials both physically and timewise?

In other words, is this League too small to participate in Rep. football to the same extent as we have this year?

Congratulations to the U17 side who took out the premiership in the Newcastle League. After surviving a heart-stopping draw in the Grand Final against Warners Bay they left no doubt as to who was the superior side by thrashing their opponents in the replay. I hope all club officials will ensure that these lads are not lost to the game and are assimilated into the senior ranks of their respective clubs next season.

Several juniors also represented the Central Coast in the Teal Cup and State U15 trials at Deniliquin and Wagga.



Interested persons at the moment are endeavouring to form a separate body to control Junior Football on the Central Coast. I wish them well in their efforts for unless something positive can be done to develop junior football the future of our game on the Coast looks bleak.

We are, as you all know, still in the throes of an unresolved umpires dispute. Umpires are an important part of our game and co-operation between them and the League is essential if the competition is to run at its optimum efficiency.

However, no one group is more important than the game itself and all participants of the game must abide by the constitution of their governing body. It was gratifying for the league executive to be given a unanimous vote of confidence by the league general committee over their handling of the umpiring situation. It is hoped that a working arrangement can be arrived at in the near future which will satisfy both the umpires and the league.

My thanks also to the Wyong Football Club for supplying emergency umpires during the period in which the official umpires withdrew their services. Their efficient handling of the umpiring duties greatly assisted the league to stage a most successful final series.

Congratulations to the players and coaches of all winning teams and to all trophy winners particularly to joint Davey Medal winners - Tony McVeigh and Ken Couchman.

I have already indicated to you that, because of business and personal commitments, I am unable to stand for re-election to any positions on the league executive for the 1986 season.

I would like to thank the outgoing executive for their support and assistance during what I consider has been a difficult year from an administrative point of view.

In conclusion, I would like to offer my best wishes for a successful season to the incoming executive.

It is very hard to thank the Umpires who gave service in the early part of the season because of the attitude they adopted just prior to the Finals and during the Finals. As Chairman of the UAB, because of lack of support or co-operation by the Umpires available, I resigned my position as Chairman hoping better support would be given to Peter Allen who accepted the responsibility of appointing Umpires but to no avail as he was handed out the same treatment.

It was apparent after a meeting of the Executive of the League with the Umpires that the Umpires did not wish to co-operate and they notified the League, they were not available for the rest of the season. The game is much bigger than the individual and with the co-operation of George Livingstone and his Wyong Club members the games carried on without further trouble and I am sure the Players and public were quite happy with the rulings given and the conducting of games by these Wyong members.

## LEAGUE ADMINISTRATION REPORT

It is a pleasure to have prepared the Tenth Annual Report of our League and as this is a milestone in our history we have tried to make it a little more interesting than usual with the additions of a few photos of some of those people who have contributed positively towards making it a year to remember.

I will once again approach this report from the three areas in which I am involved, ie Secretary, Treasurer, Registrar.

### SECRETARYS REPORT

During the past season we had twelve Executive and General Meetings. These were the formal meetings and it would be difficult to count the number of informal meetings held largely as a result of our many representative commitments and our problems with the finals.

Thanks to the efforts of many people we played twice at the Sydney Cricket Ground and were runners up in the Country Championships - a mighty effort for a League such as ours. Rob Barretts wonderful efforts as coach can not go unmentioned.

Again through the efforts of many people we managed to hold a successful finals series. I could name dozens of people but Wyong's George Livingstone and the Executives Mick Clancy and Ken Field were outstanding in the contribution.

Our files indicate that apart from the numerous letters sent to various bodies and persons your League sent 14 memos plus various circulars to each club. The finals problems resulted in a file containing over 30 items of correspondence and reports. These facts are listed so that delegates can partly visualise the work involved.

### TREASURERS REPORT

Our financial position is obviously quite sound even allowing that we have maintained players registration fees at the same level for several years and have, in fact, reduced Clubs Affiliation and Administration Fees.

At time of writing this report three clubs have not finalised their accounts. Wyong Club has settled their overdue accounts in full but the circumstances of which they availed themselves to overcome their problems will probably and hopefully never arise again. So, we have 4 clubs out of 6 who at best are slow payers or at worst are in varying financial difficulty.

May I also, once again, suggest caution with the Annual Presentation Night - a large loss could severely affect our finances.

In 1986 we may not have the heavy representative expenses of last year but a set of guernseys is required to replace those presented to the representative players.

Additionally we may not be able to gain a sponsor and this would be sorely missed.



A Treasurer's job is usually to make gloomy predictions and for this I apologise but continued careful management of the Leagues funds especially in controlling accounts receivable and payable should ensure our financial viability.

#### REGISTRARS REPORT

With only two grades to worry about and thanks to the cooperation and commonsense approach of all clubs this area of my responsibilities caused no problems. As I have said before, it is probably the most onerous and time consuming job of all - a fact evidenced by the continuous turnover of registrars in nearly all Leagues.

#### CONCLUSION

May I thank our President Ken Field for his support, foresight and fearless approach to handling our problem. May I also thank Mick Clancy and lately Peter Allen for their efforts in a most unsatisfactory area of our game. To Glen Armstrong our Publicity Officer his stand-in Bob Thomas thank you, and to Mike Vickers for his unbiased approach to League affairs, a pat on the back.

Notwithstanding the points made previously and in the interests of complete objectivity we have, as a League, lacked a certain spark of drive this year resulting in a fragmentation of our efforts, instead of a unified team approach to ensuring the progress of football, especially Juniors in our area. Whether new blood and new thinking will correct this, only the future will tell.

I have really enjoyed my association with the League over the years and am grateful for the many friends I have made. Thank you all for your help.
